# Hillary Bor Breaks Own American Record; Sarah Chelangat Sets a Female Course Record While Defending Her Title

April 7, 2024, Washington, DC: Beautiful weather paved the way for an exciting race in the men's and women's elite fields at the Credit Union Cherry Blossom 10 Mile (CUCB) as Sarah Chelangat from Uganda repeated as the women's champion and Hillary Bor broke his own American 10 Mile record by 16 seconds, which he set at last year's CUCB.

Bor's record-breaking time of 45:57 earned him the title of 2024 USATF 10 Mile National Champion and \$12,500 in prize money. Second place American **Nathan Martin** also broke Bor's previous record, finishing in 46:00. Bor finished third overall behind **Wesley Kiptoo** from Kenya, whose winning time was 45:54.

Kiptoo broke away from the pack at the end with a final kick to beat fellow countryman **Raymond Magut**, who finished second in 45:55. Kiptoo and Magut received a time bonus for running sub-46 minutes.

In the women's race - which started 12 minutes prior to the men's start to avoid men pacing women and to ensure "women's only" status for any records set - Chelangat pulled away from her competitors early in the race and maintained her commanding lead to win in a time of 51:14, besting her time from of 52:04 from 2023. Chelangat's time is a new event record for women. American **Emily Durgin** was second in 51:26 and, like Bor, earned the title of 2024 USATF 10 Mile National Champion. Durgin was three seconds behind the current women's American record. Chelangat and Durgin received time bonuses for running sub-52 minutes.

Road Runners Club of America (RRCA) prize money totaling \$6,000 was awarded to the top three male and female RRCA RunPro Camp Alumni. **Abbabiya Simbassa** and **Annie Frisbie** each earned \$1500 as the winners of this subset of elite athletes.

- Kasanesh Ayenew 51:38, Ethiopia \$2,500 for third place overall.
- Rachel Smith 51:40, Flagstaff, AZ \$1,500 for fourth place overall and \$5,000 for placing second among American women, for a total of \$6.500.

Saturday's cool, breezy temperatures didn't slow down runners in The Credit Union Cherry Blossom 5K presented by Asics, as last year's female champion, Casey Greenwalt, defended her title. This marked the second year that the 5K was held at Freedom Plaza on Saturday before the 10 Mile. Lucite awards were given to the top five men and women, the top three non-binary runners and the top women's pushrim wheelchair.

The Credit Union Cherry Blossom Kids Run presented by Warner Brothers Discovery followed the 5K. Kids ranging in age from 4 to 10 raced with Stumpy the mascot for a fun half mile course. This marked the first year that the Kids Run was held at Freedom Plaza, having previously been run at the National Building Museum.

Other notable runners in the 10 Mile today included: **Ben Beach** (2:01:26), the only person to have competed in and completed every Cherry Blossom 10 Mile; and U.S. Secretary of the Interior **Deb Haaland** (1:59:18).

Throughout the National Cherry Blossom Festival (March 20 - April 14), of which CUCB is an official partner event, runners are able to participate in the Credit Union Cherry Blossom Virtual Run. Registration closes on April 7, and the last day to run is April 14<sup>th</sup>. More information about the Virtual Run can be found here.

For the past 22 years, Credit Union Miracle Day has been the title sponsor of the Credit Union Cherry Blossom 10 Mile and 5K, adding the Kids Run to its portfolio when the ½-mile event debuted in 2016. Asics was the presenting sponsor of this year's 5K, and Warner Bros. Discovery presented the Kids Run. Wegmans has been the presenting sponsor of the Health and Fitness expo for three years.

Over the 22 years of Credit Union Miracle Day title sponsorship, the partnership with CUCB organizers and charitable runners has generated over \$11.1 million for the Children's Miracle Network Hospitals. This year's fundraising effort totaled \$550,000, which included \$169,000 from runners.

The 5K begins at Freedom Plaza and proceeds down Pennsylvania Ave. to the U.S. Capitol building, tracing the route of Presidential Inaugurations. The event serves as a fundraiser for the Children's Miracle Network Hospitals, a consortium of 170 premier children's hospitals across North America. About one-third of the funds raised support Washington, D.C.'s own Children's National ("Children's Hospital"). The event also funds the Road Runners Club of America's "RunPro Camp," a program to teach top recently-graduated U.S. collegiate distance runners about life as a professional runner.
